

The formal ceremony included the appropriate honors, followed by an official photograph, which memorialized the meeting between the Carabineros de Chile and the Inter-American Defense College at one of the most emblematic sites in the United States. This moment, laden with symbolism, also reflected the spirit of brotherhood that characterizes the relations between Chile's security forces and the defense institutions of the hemisphere.

After the ceremony at Arlington Cemetery, the delegation moved to the Inter-American Defense College, and toured the campus. There was also an institutional presentation given by Captain Alejandro Demuner, who outlined the IADC mission, vision, and training programs, highlighting its role as an academic institution that brings together the member states of the Organization of American States (OAS).

The Carabineros of Chile visit the Inter-American Defense College (Continuation)

Both institutions agreed on the importance of spaces for ongoing dialogue and joint educational programs to develop leaders in security and defense.

Afterwards, the IADC Director hosted a reception at his residence, and the Carabineros' spouses were also invited to attend, which fostered closer ties among those who accompany and support the professionals assigned to both institutions.

Ecuador's Joint Military Defense Academy visits the Inter-American Defense College

The Inter-American Defense College (IADC) received an official visit from the Joint Military Defense Academy of the Armed Forces of Ecuador (ADEMIL), as part of an international academic tour aimed at strengthening geostrategic understanding and promoting cooperation in hemispheric defense and security.

The delegation was led by Colonel Luis Fernando Pillajo García, Director of ADEMIL, and included prominent Ecuadorian authorities and representatives of international organizations. Among them were Dr. Guillermo Moncayo, Assistant Secretary of the Inter-American Committee against Terrorism (CICTE) of the OAS Secretariat for Multidimensional Security; Dr. Mónica Real, Alternate Delegate of Ecuador to the Organization of American States (OAS); and Colonel Rober Gaona Abad, Permanent Delegate of Ecuador to the Inter-American Defense Board (IADB).

The day began with a welcome ceremony and official photograph, followed by an institutional presentation by Colonel Petronio Segarra, who gave a detailed overview of the mission, vision, and academic structure of the Inter-American Defense College, as well as its role in training strategic leaders within the Inter-American system.

This was followed by a lecture entitled "IADC Response to Multidimensional Defense and Security Challenges in the Hemisphere," given by Brigadier General (R) Juan Carlos Gómez, who addressed current challenges in regional security, including transnational threats and civil-military cooperation.

This was followed by a presentation by Dr. Guillermo Moncayo, Assistant Secretary of CICTE at the OAS, entitled "The OAS and its Role in the Western Hemisphere: a System of Alliances and International Cooperation." In his presentation, he highlighted the importance of multilateralism and strategic alliances in addressing common challenges.

At the conclusion of the meeting, the ADEMIL delegation and IADC leadership exchanged ideas and reaffirmed their commitment to strengthen academic cooperation between the institutions. There was also an opportunity to share best practices in teaching, research, and developing multidimensional security strategies, which reaffirmed IADC's role as a space for dialogue, research, and leadership training in the hemisphere.





Class 65 Study Trip to West Point and New York City

Class 65 students at the Inter-American Defense College (IADC), accompanied by leadership, faculty, and staff, took a field trip to West Point and New York City as part of their academic program.

The main objective of the trip was to broaden students' understanding of political, economic, social, and cultural aspects of the United States through direct immersion in some of the country's most emblematic and representative places.

The visit began on Monday, August 25, at the United States Military Academy at West Point, a prestigious institution for training U.S. military leaders.

On Tuesday, August 26, the agenda focused on diplomacy and international economics. The day began at the United Nations (UN) and was followed by a presentation on the financial sector in Manhattan.

Wednesday, August 27, was dedicated to cultural outings. In the morning, participants visited Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty, symbols of immigration and freedom in the United States.

During the visit, Ambassador Savage learned firsthand about the College's academic mission, its strategic training programs, and the role it plays in promoting security and collective defense in the Americas.




